*Answer each with True or False.*

- \_\_\_\_\_ 1. A game may be started with a team having only eight players present, provided the ninth player arrives before his spot in the lineup comes to bat.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 2. Even after his or her partner has left the field at the end of the game, the umpire-in-chief may correct a scoring error when one team correctly informs him of the mistake prior to his leaving the field.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 3. The penalty for an illegal substitute shall supersede the penalty for batting out of order.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 4. In the top of the fourth inning, the coach of the team on offense fails to inform the umpire that eligible substitute Jones is batting for Baker. After Jones gets on base, the defense appeals for an illegal substitution. The umpire should call Jones out and restrict him to the dugout.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 5. Only the head coach may leave the coaches box for purposes of questioning a judgment call.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 6. If a fight breaks out, any player who left the dugout or their position on the field is ejected.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 7. When lightning is seen or thunder is heard, play should be suspended for a minimum of 20 minutes.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 8. If a team drops down to eight players, they can continue to play, but an out will be called when the missing player's turn at bat comes up.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 9. Players are warming up beyond first base and in foul territory. The area is unprotected. The umpire requires that another player with a glove be positioned between them and the batter. The umpire is following the correct procedure.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 10. The score is tied in the top of the fifth inning and R3 is at third. B2 hits a single to right. R3 scores and several players leave the dugout to congratulate R3. The umpire issues a warning to the head coach that the next offender to leave the dugout while play is in progress will be ejected. The coach argues vehemently and the umpire restricts him to the bench. The umpire is correct in all respects.
